They can go to an emergency shelter for families without electrical power due to natural disasters.

Lucky for us, Special E already services the Twin Cities, along with 29 other major metro areas. While their website doesn't disclose the exact cost of enlisting Special E's help, they say it's only a "nominal fee" to cover administrative and transportation costs.
